

2017 Educator Preparation Provider Annual Reports

In 2017, the NJ Department of Education released information to the public about the outcome of employment in relationship to the teacher preparation program. Basically, the information shows the percentage of students who found a job after they graduated from their teacher preparation program. **The state average is 65%.** The graph below highlights several factors:

1. The percentages were obtained from students who graduated and received their NJ Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing (CEAS) in 2014/2015 and AND were employed as of October 15, 2016.
2. The report shows the OVERALL percentage of students who found a job within 1 year after completing the CEAS.
3. The data shows the percentage of TRANSFER students who found a job within 1 year after completing the CEAS.
4. **The data does not show causation, but rather the likelihood of obtaining a teaching position after graduating from a particular teacher preparation program.**
